DOUBLES FINAL QUICK HITS

- The first team to qualify for this year’s Sony Ericsson Championships, **Cara Black** and **Liesel Huber** are gunning for a hat-trick of titles at the event after their wins in 2007 and last year; the last pair to score at least three in a row was 10-time winners Martina Navratilova and Pam Shriver (1986-89) while the last player to achieve the feat was Lindsay Davenport (1996-98, with three different partners).
- **Nuria Llagostera Vives** and **María José Martínez Sánchez** are making their event debut as a team, and as individuals. They are aiming to be the first Spanish duo ever to win the season-ending doubles championship. Arantxa Sánchez-Vicario won the event twice with Czech partners, Helena Sukova in 1992 and Jana Novotna in 1995. Virginia Ruano Pascual won in 2003 with Argentina’s Paola Suárez.
- In yesterday’s semifinals, **Black** and **Huber** improved their head-to-head record against Samantha Stosur and Rennae Stubbs to 3-2. **Llagostera Vives** and **Martínez Sánchez** beat the Williams sisters, in their first meeting.
- **Black** is making her 10th appearance at this event, **Huber** her fourth; it is their third season finale as a team.
- Coming into this event, **Llagostera Vives** and **Martínez Sánchez** were the only players in the eight-strong field yet to win a Grand Slam doubles title. If they win today, they’ll be the first Slam-less players to triumph at the Tour Championships since Nadia Petrova and Meghann Shaughnessy in 2004.
- Of the four players in the doubles final, **Martínez Sánchez** is the only one to win a singles title on Tour this year (Bogotá - first Tour singles title of career; and Bastad).

DOUBLES NO.1 RANKING UPDATE

- With their semifinal defeat of Stosur and Stubbs, Black and Huber secured the year-end No.1 ranking for the third consecutive year. They have been co-world No.1s without interruption since November 2007.

- **Cara Black** and **Liezel Huber** achieved the joint world No.1 doubles ranking in November 2007 and have not relinquished it since. As of this week, Black has held the No.1 spot a total of 139 weeks (second on all-time list, behind Navratilova's 237 weeks) while Huber has been No.1 a total of 103 weeks (sixth on all-time list).
- The five titles Black and Huber have won this year are the 23rd through 27th titles of their partnership.
- Black and Huber combined to win the year-end Sony Ericsson Championships in 2007 and 2008, and were the first team to qualify for the 2009 Championships in Doha.
- Black has reached eight Grand Slam doubles finals, winning at 2004 Wimbledon (w/Stubbs), 2005 Wimbledon, 2007 Australian Open, 2007 Wimbledon, 2008 US Open (all w/Huber); and finishing runner-up at 2000 US Open (w/Likhovtseva) and 2005 Roland Garros (w/Huber). She scored her 600th doubles win during the 2009 US Open.
- Huber has reached seven Grand Slam doubles finals, winning at 2005 Wimbledon, 2007 Australian Open, 2007 Wimbledon, 2008 US Open (all w/Black); and finishing runner-up at 2004 Wimbledon (w/Sugiyama) and 2005 Roland Garros (w/Black).

DOHA DOUBLES QUICK HITS

- The doubles line-up at the Sony Ericsson Championships - Doha 2009 features three teams making their first appearance at the season finale: **Serena / Venus Williams**, **Samantha Stosur / Rennae Stubbs** and **Nuria Llagostera Vives / María José Martínez Sánchez**. The Williams sisters also qualified in 1998 but did not play as Venus had left knee tendonitis.
- Individually speaking, **Llagostera Vives** and **Martínez Sánchez** are the only players who have qualified for the first time. **Stubbs** is contesting the event for the 14th time; **Black** is making her 10th appearance, **Huber** her fourth and **Stosur** her third (she has never lost a match at the tournament).
- The first team to qualify, **Cara Black and Liezel Huber** are gunning for a hat-trick of titles at the season-ending championships after their wins at Madrid in 2007 and last year here in Doha; the last pair to score at least three in a row were 10-time winners Martina Navratilova and Pam Shriver (1986-89), while the last player to achieve the feat was Lindsay Davenport (1996-98, with three different partners).
- This year's doubles field contains four former champions **Stosur** (w/Raymond, 2005-06), **Stubbs** (w/Raymond, 2001), **Black/Huber** (2007-08) and four players who have been No.1 in doubles (**Black, Huber, Stosur, Stubbs**).
- Six of the eight players in Doha have won Grand Slam doubles titles; only **Llagostera Vives** and **Martínez Sánchez** are yet to win a major.
- Four of the eight doubles players have won singles titles on the Sony Ericsson WTA Tour during 2009: **Serena** (Australian Open, Wimbledon), **Venus** (Dubai, Acapulco), **Martínez Sánchez** (Bogotá - first Tour singles title of career, Bastad) and **Stosur** (Osaka - first Tour singles title of career).

DOUBLES NO.1 RANKING UPDATE

- If Black and Huber win their semifinal match against Stosur and Stubbs, they will secure the year-end No.1 ranking – even if they ultimately lose to the Williams sisters in the final. Black and Huber have been co-world No.1s without interruption since November 2007.

- **Rennae Stubbs** is appearing at the Tour Championships for the 14th time; Stosur is her fifth different partner at the event, after Lori McNeil, Lisa Raymond, Cara Black and Kveta Peschke (with whom she was runner-up last year). **Samantha Stosur** is making her third appearance at the event; she won the title with Raymond in 2005 and 2006 – both at the expense of Black and Stubbs.
- Stubbs's 59 Tour doubles titles places her 12th on the all-time list; 20 Stosur's 22 doubles titles were won with Lisa Raymond (other two were with Bryanne Stewart).
- Stubbs has spent three weeks at No.1 in the doubles rankings (first rose to No.1 August 21, 2000); Stosur has spent 61 weeks at No.1 in doubles (first date February 6, 2006).
- Stosur's appearance in this year's Wimbledon final (w/Stubbs; runners-up) represented her sixth career Grand Slam doubles final. She won the titles at the 2005 US Open and 2006 Roland Garros and was runner-up at 2006 Australian Open, 2008 Wimbledon, 2008 US Open (all w/Raymond).
- Stubbs has been to seven Grand Slam doubles finals, for four wins (three w/ Raymond: 2000 Australian Open, 2001 Wimbledon and 2001 US Open; one w/Black: 2004 Wimbledon); she finished as runner-up at 1995 US Open (w/Schultz-McCarthy), 2002 Roland Garros (w/Raymond) and 2009 Wimbledon (w/Stosur)
- Representing Australia, Stosur and Stubbs combined for a 4-0 Fed Cup record between 2006 and 2009 (incl. zonal ties); they also posted a 1-1 record at 2008 Beijing Olympics (l. to Medina Garrigues/Ruano Pascual in second round).
- Fourth team to secure qualification for Sony Ericsson Championships – Doha 2009.

- **Venus** and **Serena Williams**, along with Lisa Raymond, are the only active players to have completed the career doubles Grand Slam (2001/2003/2009 Australian Open, 1999 Roland Garros, 2000/2002/2008 Wimbledon, 1999 US Open); there are 10 others who have done it in the Open Era (Margaret Court, Martina Navratilova, Kathy Jordan, Anne Smith, Pam Shriver, Jana Novotna, Helena Sukova, Gigi Fernandez, Natasha Zvereva, Martina Hingis).
- At the 2009 US Open Venus and Serena won their 10th Grand Slam doubles title. In seven of their 10 doubles wins one of them has also won the singles title: 1999 US Open (Serena), 2000 Wimbledon (Venus), 2002 Wimbledon (Serena), 2003 Australian Open (Serena), 2008 Wimbledon (Venus), 2009 Australian Open (Serena) and 2009 Wimbledon (Serena).
- With their title run at the 2009 US Open, Venus and Serena became the first doubles team to win three Grand Slams in a year since Virginia Ruano Pascual and Paola Suarez in 2004 (Australian Open, Roland Garros, US Open).
- Venus and Serena are the third-most successful partnership in the Open Era in terms of Grand Slam doubles titles; the most successful was Martina Navratilova and Pam Shriver (who won 21), followed by Gigi Fernandez and Natasha Zvereva (14).
- Venus and Serena arrive in Doha with a 130-17 lifetime record together, winning 16 titles (which includes 10 Grand Slams and two Olympic gold medals (2000, 2008); they are 16-1 in career doubles finals losing only at 1999 San Diego (to Davenport and Corina Morariu); they are 10-0 in Grand Slam doubles finals.
- Venus and Serena have amassed a 24-1 win-loss record this year, their only loss coming to Bethanie Mattek-Sands and Nadia Petrova in the 3r of Roland Garros.
- Venus has only played four times with other players, going 1-4 (0-1 with Chanda Rubin, 0-1 with Corina Morariu and 0-1 with Lisa Raymond, but 1-1 with Caroline Wozniacki to reach the Doha quarterfinals in 2008).
- Serena has only played twice with other players, going 5-1 (1-1 with Martina Navratilova to reach the quarterfinals of 2002 Tokyo [Princess Cup] and 4-0 with Alexandra Stevenson to win 2002 Leipzig the week later).
- Were second team to secure qualification for Sony Ericsson Championships – Doha 2009.
